



Tiziano Faravelli is professor at Politecnico di Milano, where he is head of the Chemical Engineering Section of the Department of Chemistry, Materials and Chemical Engineering. He received his PhD from Politecnico di Milano in 1990. His main research activity is in the field of chemical reaction engineering of complex systems. In particular, his interest is devoted to pyrolysis, partial oxidation and combustion modeling of gas, liquid and solid fuels, both fossil and renewable fuels, with attention to pollutant formation (NO_x, SO_x, PAH and soot). He also investigates the heterogeneous combustion of liquids (droplets) and solids (detailed modeling at the particle size). Finally, he works on mechanism validation and reduction for application to the study of turbulence/kinetics interactions. He is author of more than 190 papers (6314 citations, h-index=44). He is currently member of the Editorial Board of the Proceedings of Combustion Institute and Associate Editor of Combustion and Flame.
